The vision of a “new heaven and a new earth” constitutes the final scene of the Book of Revelation, and John intends these words to inaugurate a new beginning. Revelation is written to a Christian community in the throes of a violent persecution, and its people have grown weary in their hope for the Lord’s return. Their primary concern is undoubtedly how much longer they must endure this world as they know it. John’s response is the command to see what he has seen: “Behold, I make all things new.”

Yet, where are the people to look? The answer to this question is precisely the Church. The Lord has established the Church as “the holy city, a new Jerusalem.” It is the Church that is “prepared as a bride adorned for her husband.” Because the Church exists on earth, the “former heaven and the former earth” are no more. All things have been made new in the creation of Christ’s Church. Yet the lived reality feels nothing like a new creation. Thus, the voice from heaven cries out with words of assurance. The Lord promises to be with his people. He will dry the tears from their eyes, destroy death, and take away their “mourning,” “wailing,” and “pain.” These signs of despair have no place in a Church guided by hope.
