Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

God establishes his covenant with Israel to be a mutual expression of fidelity and love. When God brought the Israelites out of Egypt, led them through the wilderness to Mount Sinai, and there both gave and subsequently renewed a covenant with the people, he left no doubt as to what needed to be attended to in their mutual relationship. God would journey with his people and bring them into the land flowing with milk and honey. The people, for their part, would simply have to demonstrate a daily willingness to sacrifice to God and to trust in him completely. This test would prove difficult for the Israelites.

In today's reading from Deuteronomy, Moses, at the age of one hundred and twenty, assembles the people to renew the covenant. Afterwards, he would pass the leadership of the people to Joshua, who would have the responsibility of guiding them into the Promised Land. The Israelites' forty years of wandering through the desert has come to an end; now is the time for them to confirm their identity as God's Chosen People.

This identity is found primarily in the act of listening to the voice of God. Moses instructs the Israelites at the outset of their journey "listen closely to the voice of the Lord, your God" (Exodus 15:26). The essential Jewish prayer, the *Shema* ("hear," in Hebrew) begins, "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone" (Deuteronomy 6:4). Moses suggests to the people that they ought not make this hearing overly difficult; the Law is not found way up in the sky or far off on the sea. It is, rather, on the lips and in the hearts of those to whom it has been given. For this very reason, it is crucial for subsequent generation to be taught the fullness of the Law and therefore maintain God's truth within the heart of the nation. In this way, it will be impossible for Israel to abandon the covenant completely. (taken from: workbook for Lectors 2022)
