Throughout his letter to the Galatians, Paul reveals a struggle with a group of Judaizers, who taught that the Hebrew law regarding circumcision continued to be in force for all Christians. The mark of circumcision is meant to be a source of identification that separates a people from others. The Judaizers believes this mark to be particularly important to distinguish faithful believers apart from the pagan world. The mark itself was something that allowed for boasting because it spoke of giving the body over to new allegiance. However, for Paul, the only mark that matters is the cross of Christ and all that giving oneself over to it demands.

Paul speaks of the world being crucified to him and he to the world. Paul knows well that the world was created by God as good; he also knows that the world contains many allurements that could take control of the senses. **Baptism into Christ means that the world's power to seduce no longer holds sway over Christians, who are a "new creation."** Such new creation cannot come about by the marking of the flesh in circumcision but only with the inner and total transformation into Christ. That is the "rule" to be followed in the Church.

As Paul brings his correspondence with the Galatians to an end, he utters a prayer that his suffering, brought on by such opponents as the Judaizers, may cease and that his word may be heard as authentic, since he bears the marks of Jesus on his body. Paul sees himself as having been branded in the Lord and therefore should be known to be willing to endure great hardships on the Lord's behalf.
