Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Scripture spotlight struggles that come to those who choose to live by God's word rather than by traditional human advice and practice. The first reading shows the prophet Jeremiah suffering for relaying an unpopular message from the Lord to his contemporaries in Jerusalem. He is telling them that they should submit to the Babylonians who have conquered but not yet destroyed the city. Jerusalem is under siege. Food and water supplies are dwindling.

In the second reading the author of Hebrews reminds the baptized that committing their life to Jesus will entail suffering, but also that no one suffers alone. He draws our attention to that great cloud of witnesses who surround us at all times and inspire us to "rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us."
