Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time

Someone asked Jesus, "Lord, will only a few people be saved?" Jesus does not give a direct answer, perhaps because preoccupation with the issue distracts from or becomes an excuse for not carrying out one's unique mission for the Lord, for not entering through the narrow gate. This entrance requires strenuous effort. Jesus declares that many will not be strong enough to do this.

Jesus warns his disciples and us that one day, the master will rise up and lock the narrow door, and they will gather outside and beg him to open it. Jesus, who was previously compassionate and forgiving, will say to them, "I do not know where you are from." Shocked, those who call themselves his disciples rattle off activities that they thought guaranteed their salvation: they shared meals with Jesus and heard his teachings (as we do at every Eucharist).

Jesus calls these nominal disciples "evildoers." He then declares that at the end of time there will be wailing and grinding of teeth. Those who are Jesus' disciples in name only will experience eternal anxiety and regret when they see Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, all the prophets and foreigners from all corners of the earth reclining at table in the kingdom of God and no place reserved for them.

Like, Isaiah, Jesus pushes his hearers outside the comfort of their little local community by reminding them that he has stellar faithful disciples around the globe. His final saying warns us that when he returns, we could find ourselves standing outside the narrow gate, watching a diverse group of people pass into the kingdom of God.
