Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

In the passage preceding today's Gospel, Jesus assures his disciples that the Father knows and provides for all their needs. Now he tells them to stop being afraid, for the Father is also pleased to give them the kingdom. Jesus turns the thoughts of his hearers to the value of this great gift by contrasting its riches with the possessions that people acquire and then fret about maintaining and keeping safe. He tells his disciples to sell their stuff, give alms, and then work for lasting heavenly riches. When he says, "where your treasure is, there also will your heart be," he means that what ever preoccupies us, sustains our emotions, and engages our will indicates what is truly most important to us.

Jesus warns his disciples that those who live as if this world were all there is, who seek its treasures and pleasures instead of heavenly ones, will be shocked when he shows up and judges them, removing all delusions that they are his disciples. He will assign them an unchangeable and eternal place with the unfaithful. Their punishment will be harsher than that of other wrongdoers who were ignorant of Jesus' will.

Jesus reminds us today that discipleship is extremely demanding, and that the kingdom is a gift whose value exceeds all others. More is demanded of Jesus' disciples than of other people. Blessed are they whom he finds ready to work and with their lamps lit when he returns. (taken from: workbook for Lectors 2022)
