**Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary time**

**Scripture lessons summarized:** In the first reading, Amos, the prophet of social justice, condemns the crooked business practices of the 8<sup>th</sup> century BC Jewish merchants of Judea and reminds the Israelites and us to be faithful to our Covenant with Yahweh, God of Justice. We need to practice justice and mercy to all, as God's faithful stewards. Amos warns us also against setting making money by any means as the goal of our life. Today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 113) reminds us that the All-seeing God protects and cares for the poor. In the second reading, St. Paul instructs the first century Judeo-Christians to become true stewards of the Gospel of Jesus, the only mediator, by preaching the "Good News" to the pagans and by including them in intercessory prayers, too. Today's Gospel story tells us about the crooked, but resourceful, manager and challenges us to use our blessings — time, talents, health, and wealth — wisely and justly so that they will serve us for our good in eternity. We use our earthly wealth wisely when we spend it for our own needs in moderation and when we love and help the needy around us, because these are the purposes for which God has entrusted His blessings to us.
